Field trip to Sinjajevina

This day is planned as a drive up to the highlands of Sinjajevina by several 4x4 cars (from 1,000 masl in Bianca hotel / Kolasin, to 1,800 masl in Sinjajevina). We will visit the pastures and pastoral settlements - *katuns* - with their church, and some of the people and animals that will still be present (e.g. katun Okruljak). Please note that the weather is not optimal in this period (cloudy or even a bit rainy, with a temperature of about 5-10 °C), so please come minimally equipped. There will not be a lot of walking but small circles of 100 meters or so can be done. Field trip lunch is planned in Katun Potrk. A local family will prepare traditional food, and then we will go back down to Kolasin. The 4x4 cars should start at 10am from Hotel Bianca in Kolasin and they should be back down with everybody at around 5pm, so if some people want to use the swimming pool or spa of the Hotel, they also may do so.
